The Instruments of The Orchestra

An orchestra is a large group of musicians that play together. Within the orchestra there are different families of instruments. They are: Strings, Woodwind, Brass and Percussion.

Strings

The instruments from the string family are: violin, viola, cello, double bass and harp.

Strings instruments can be plucked (pizzicato) or played with the bow (arco)

Brass

The instruments from the brass family are: trumpet, trombone, tuba and horn.

The trumpet, horn and tuba are all played with valves. The trombone is played with a slide.



Percussion

Instruments from the percussion family are instruments that can be hit or shaken.

Percussion instruments can be tuned (can play different pitches) or un-tuned.



Skills developed


To be able to play 'Ode to Joy' by Beethoven, on the ukulele.
