FAIRTRADE	Fairtrade	is when producers in developing countries are paid a fair price for their work, by companies in developed countries. It's when the price we pay for products gives enough to producers for them to afford life's essentials - like food, education and healthcare.		
SSOCIATION CARANTON	Organic	Foods have been grown without the use of chemical fertilisers or pesticides. For example organic carrots or potatoes.		
Freedom foods		Is the RSPCA's farm assurance and food labelling scheme, which inspects farms to strict RSPCA welfare standards.
