Also joining the bus will be a representative from the children's centre who will provide information and support on resources available at local children's centres and one of our local school nurses from our 0-19 +service will be with us to offer support, advice, and guidance on care in schools.

<u>#AskAboutAsthma</u> is an annual campaign is led by NHS England – London and encourages simple changes to children and young people's care that will make a big difference to how they experience their asthma. The campaign runs in September to coincide with children's return to school and the annual "September surge" in asthma presentations to urgent and emergency care.
