2: MEASURING TIME: BC AND AD DATES

2000BC 1000BC 0 1000AD 2000AD

- The bigger a BC date is then the further back in time it is.
- The bigger an AD date is the more recent it is.

- 1. Cover up the last two digits in a year. e.g. 1989
- 2. Add 1 to the year i.e. 19 + 1 = 20. So 1989 is in the Twentieth Century.
- 3. If there are only 1 or 2 digits e.g. 4AD, 99BC or 48AD, then that date will ALWAYS be in the 1st century BC/AD...ALWAYS!

SECONDARY SOURCES

A Secondary source is a second-hand account that interprets primary sources. They often use primary sources as the basis for their content.
